

RULES:

LORRIES & TRAILERS MUST PARK IN THE TOP CAR PARK. NO HORSE/ PONY MUST BE LEFT IN A TRAILER, WHICH HAS BEEN DETACHED, FROM THE TOWING VEHICLE.

LORRY & VEHICLE PARKING: All Competitors & others must adhere to instructions from the Parking Stewards when given!

Competitors **MUST NOT** muck out vehicles on College premises, nor allow their Horses or Ponies to walk or graze on grass verges at any time. Restricted Areas include both top & bottom stable yards, the farm & its environs, The Machinery dept. & any machinery.

DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE COLLEGE CAMPUS AT ANY TIME (NON-NEGOTIABLE - COLLEGE RULE)

To be run under British Riding Clubs Competitions 2009 Official Rules.

- It is the competitors responsibility to familiarise themselves with the BRC Rules - Qualifier classes to be run & judged in accordance with BRC Competitions 2009 Official Rules.
- Flu vaccination Passport/certificates must be presented with the horse & WILL be checked prior to any Horse/pony competing in a qualifier class. Non-compliance with this rule will incur elimination.
- A tack inspection will be carried out for all horses / ponies prior to competing in a Qualifier class. It is compulsory to wear Hard Hats to at least the minimum BHS Kite Mark standard, for everyone mounted whether competing or not, at or in the vicinity of any Official British Riding Club Competition. *(The hat is to be fitted with a three pronged harness & chin strap which is properly adjusted and fastened)* Where a hat is a skullcap style, this must be worn with a silk. All hats must carry the quality assurance stamp of Kite mark EN1384, PAS015 or prefixed with ASTM F1163. These are considered to offer greater protection. SEI American standard SNELL E2001 and Australian New Zealand Standard SNZ3838 1998 are also acceptable Failure to comply with the above rule will incur Elimination.
- **Correct Dress please.** For show jumping Body protectors are strongly recommended. The Organisers reserve the right to cancel /alter the event/ class in any way. And cannot be held responsible for any error in the time schedule.
- All persons attending do so at their own risk. Southerndown Riding Club, its officials and Agents cannot be held responsible for any accident, theft, loss, damage, injury or illness howsoever caused, arising out of or at this competition.
- Each Competitor/spectator (or, where applicable, the parent or guardian) shall be solely responsible for consequences of loss or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from, any Animal and indemnify The Southerndown Riding Club, officials, agents, invitees, and the Showground owners against all damages, actions, claims, proceedings, costs and /or expenses in relation to or arising from his/her entries in the show. Children under 16 must be under adult supervision at all times.
- **(NO REFUND WHATSOEVER WILL BE GIVEN.)**
- Misuse of whips or spurs will be penalised by Judges
- The Judges decision is final.
- Horses or Ponies must be 4 years of age or over
- Any objection must be lodged with the secretary within 15 minutes of the end of the class concerned together with a deposit of £20.00 returnable only if the objection is sustained.
- The Committee reserves the right to refuse entry to any class without explanation except to the appropriate body.

Health Safety & welfare

The organisers of this event have taken every reasonable precaution to ensure the health & safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid & prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials & stewards.

Other than notional prize money gained in 70cm & 80cm classes at BSJA Into shows All horses may be currently registered with BE but must not have any BE points.

ROYAL WINDSOR COMPETITIONS
These New competitions are for “Grass Roots” Riders

From our recent survey, there do not appear to be many, if any clubs planning a first round for the above competitions.

As rule O4S. In the BRC.2009 rule book (*Full rules page77*) allows a suitable alternative competition to be used for a first round of the Top Score classes, and in order to help promote these classes. It has been proposed to hold a first round competition for both junior & seniors, within the coming Novice Indoor Team Show jumping being held in February at Pencoed College. The rules of this class are the same as always

How it will work:

Basically each club will be able to nominate the highest placed member in their team (*subject to the eligibility of the rider*) to go forward to the second round competition, which will be a “Novice Top Score” competition. And will be held some time in March before the 27th

This will give each club the opportunity to put a competitor forward to round two. If the highest placed team member is ineligible, because of previous BSJA prize winnings on any horse, the qualifying place will pass down to the next highest placed team member.

You will find provision to nominate a rider with horse/pony in the attached schedule. You will also find a copy of the rules for round 2. Being held in March dtbc.

ROYAL WINDSOR QUALIFIER FOR 2010
Guidelines for Top Score Show jumping and BRC. Riding Test

BSJA Rule 273. (Modified)

- The order of starting must be drawn
- Water jumps & combination obstacles are not allowed.
- The time allowed is 60 seconds
- The round starts when a competitor crosses the start line in either direction
- The competitor chooses which obstacle to jump & may do so in either direction
- The competitor scores the number of points allotted to each obstacle provided it is jumped clear. No points are scored for obstacles knocked down.
- An obstacle which is knocked down or displaced for any reason is not rebuilt. This includes the displacement of a lower element in the same vertical plane.
- Each obstacle may be jumped twice to score, jumping voluntarily or otherwise an obstacle for the third subsequent time, or jumping or passing through an obstacle already knocked down or displaced, including the displacement of a lower element does not incur elimination but scores no points.
- Disobediences are not penalised since they decrease the time available in which to score, a competitor may either attempt the same obstacle again or proceed to the next obstacle of his choice. A second or subsequent
- disobedience does not incur elimination but the judge may retire a competitor if it becomes apparent that repeated disobediences have destroyed all chance of the competitor featuring in the prize list.
- The bell is rung as soon as the time allowed is reached. The competitor must then cross the finishing line in either direction to allow his time to be recorded... If he does not cross the finishing line, he is placed last of the competition with the same number of points.
- The number of points allotted to the last obstacle jumped clear will be included in the competitors score provided the horse has already started to take of at the moment when the time allowed is reached.
- Jumping an additional obstacle or obstacles after the bell has rung is not penalised.
- The joker must be built as an upright (not a spread) obstacle. The joker may be jumped twice to score, if jumped clear, 200 points are added to the score, but if the joker is knocked down, 200 points are deducted from the score.
